

## Adobe Reader 9 Navigation (Moving Around)



First Choose "Tools" From The Top Tool Bar And Then "Customize Toolbars". Next, Scroll To The Bottom Of The "More Tools" Window And Make Sure That "Page Navigation Tools", And All Of The Page Navigation Tools Below It Are Selected. Then Make Sure The "Select & Zoom Toolbar" Is Selected, And That Only "Select Tool", "Hand Tool", "Dynamic Zoom", "Zoom Out", "Zoom In", And "Zoom Value" Are Selected. Next, Close "More Tools" And You're Ready To Navigate (Move Around).

Now, Besides Using The [Navigation](#) Buttons In "The New Alphabet" To Change Pages, You Can Select The Adobe Reader "Hand" Tool" That Grips The Page When You Press Your Mouse Button To Move The Page, Too.

You Can Also Use The Round Arrow Buttons On The Top Tool Bar To Go Thru All Of Your Page Moves, Forwards (To The Front) Or Backwards (Back). The Arrows With Horizontal (Side Side) Bars To The Left Of The Page Number Box Will Take You To The First And Last Page Of The Ebook, And The Arrows Without Bars Will Move You One Page At A Time In Either Direction, Forwards (Front) Or Backwards (Back). Hold The Cursor Arrow Over A Tool To Read About Its Use.

When Using The "Zoom" Tool (Like For Looking At The Artwork Up Close) You Should Learn To Click On The Round "+" And "-" To Zoom In And Out, Plus Click On The Small Black "Down" Arrow On The Right Hand Side Of The Zoom Percentage (%) To Select "Fit Width", Which Is The Best Percentage (%) For Reading. To Zoom In On An Object (Something), Select The Magnifying Glass (A Tool Which Makes Things Look Bigger) And Then Click On The Object (Something) And Hold The Mouse Button Down While You Move The Magnifying Glass Up And Down. Choose The Hand On The Top Tool Bar When You Are Through Zooming. Next, Click The Two Page Views On The Right Hand Side Of The Top Tool Bar To See Them Take You To "Full Page" And Back To "Page Width". Hold The Cursor Over The Page Views To Read About Them. Then, Select "View" To See Some More Tools.

Next, Find The "Bookmarks" Icon (Symbol) On The Left Tool Bar For Additional (More) Help Finding The Pages You Are Looking For. Adobe Reader Also Has A Very Good "Help" Section (Part).

### Getting The Latest Adobe Reader Version (One They Make) For Your Computer

Click "Help" On The Adobe Reader's Top Toolbar To See What Version (One They Make) "About" Says You Are Using. When You Are Online, Click The "Get Adobe Reader" Icon (Symbol) Above, And Adobe Will Help You Be Sure You Have The Latest One They Make For Your Computer. Note: Older And Newer Version's Tools May Be Different (Not The Same).

### Updating Adobe Reader

To Check With Adobe For Updates: Click "Help" On The Top Toolbar And Select "Check For Updates". Then Use The Instructions (What To Do) From Adobe To Update (Make It The New One).

### Getting Back To "Home"

The Arrows With Horizontal (Left To Right) Bars To The Left Of The Page Number Box Will Take You To The First And Last Page Of The Ebook.
